

PGY1 Pharmacy Residency

About the Program

DHR Health in conjunction with the faculty associated with the University Houston College of Pharmacy, is offering a Post Graduate Year 1 (PGY1) pharmacy residency program with an ambulatory care track designed to advance the practice of post graduate pharmacists. The PGY 1 pharmacy residency is a twelve-month program designed to expose residents to a comprehensive clinical environment in which they will develop knowledge and skills in direct patient care in both ambulatory and acute care settings, teaching and research.

The program is designed to develop the following competencies:

- Patient Care (R1)
- Advancing Practice and Improving Patient Care (R2)
- Leadership and Management (R3)
- Teaching, Education, and Dissemination of Knowledge (R4)
- Teaching and Learning (E6)

This DHR Health PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program (Track B) offers rotational, longitudinal and concentrated learning experiences throughout the year.

Residents will have 9 required rotations and 2 elective rotations. Rotations will be 2 to 6 weeks, depending on the rotation type. Longitudinal rotations are scheduled experiences for 3 months, 6 months, or 12 months. The residents will have scheduled time throughout the year to ensure completion of the longitudinal learning experiences. (i.e. research time, academic preparation time, etc.) This time will be referred to as administrative time.
